

Daniel 11 – p.1

17 He shall also set his face to enter with the strength of his whole kingdom, and upright ones with him; thus shall he do: and he shall give him the daughter of women, corrupting her: but she shall not stand on his side, neither be for him.

18 After this shall he turn his face unto the isles, and shall take many: but a prince for his own behalf shall cause the reproach offered by him to cease; without his own reproach he shall cause it to turn upon him.

19 Then he shall turn his face toward the fort of his own land: but he shall stumble and fall, and not be found.

20 Then shall stand up in his estate a raiser of taxes in the glory of the kingdom: but within few days he shall be destroyed, neither in anger, nor in battle.

21 And in his estate shall stand up a vile person, to whom they shall not give the honour of the kingdom: but he shall come in peaceably, and obtain the kingdom by flatteries.

22 And with the arms of a flood shall they be overflowed from before him, and shall be broken; yea, also the prince of the covenant.

23 And after the league made with him he shall work deceitfully: for he shall come up, and shall become strong with a small people.

24 He shall enter peaceably even upon the fattest places of the province; and he shall do that which his fathers have not done, nor his fathers' fathers; he shall scatter among them the prey, and spoil, and riches: yea, and he shall forecast his devices against the strong holds, even for a time.

25 And he shall stir up his power and his courage against the king of the south with a great army; and the king of the south shall be stirred up to battle with a very great and mighty army; but he shall not stand: for they shall forecast devices against him.

26 Yea, they that feed of the portion of his meat shall destroy him, and his army shall overflow: and many shall fall down slain.

27 And both these kings' hearts shall be to do mischief, and they shall speak lies at one table; but it shall not prosper: for yet the end shall be at the time appointed.

28 Then shall he return into his land with great riches; and his heart shall be against the holy covenant; and he shall do exploits, and return to his own land.

29 At the time appointed he shall return, and come toward the south; but it shall not be as the former, or as the latter.

30 ¶ For the ships of Chittim shall come against him: therefore he shall be grieved, and return, and have indignation against the holy covenant: so shall he do; he shall even return, and have intelligence with them that forsake the holy covenant.

The heading of Daniel 11 tells us this is about the wars/presidents that lead up to the Second Coming.

Daniel sees the successive kings and their wars, leagues, and conflicts that lead up to the Second Coming of Christ.

Then he describes several wars (JHBush being the first time to go to war in the Middle East.) Finally getting to the last three kings (#6, #7, #8) and at the end of #8 we go to Daniel 12:1 when continues that AOA just happened when #8 dies.

#6 is a pedophile. He will go to war in the Isles (Pacific Ocean) and then a prince (son) will cause disapproval to cease against his father or it will turn against #6, but....

This president stumbles and falls and not be found. Do you know a president who stumbles and falls all the time?

#7 is short lived. Dies within days. This is a huge "marker" for those watching for prophecy to be accurate. (GAS talks of a president being elected but dies before taking office. DOZ talks of a president dying in office. John talks of #7 being a short time. Ezra talks of a short feather in the spot before the final president.)

#8 is the vile person. He is the one who goes against the saints as mentioned in Vs. 30, so he is the one mentioned in Dan 7 as well.

He is not elected and he comes in during a civil war.

The prophet is also broken (no interpretation).

#8 works deceitfully. He is no longer the person he was once thought of, but remain strong with his supporters, who also support pushing against the saints.

Daniel 11 – p. 2

31 And arms shall stand on his part, and they shall pollute the sanctuary of strength, and shall take away the daily sacrifice, and they shall place the abomination that maketh desolate.

32 And such as do wickedly against the covenant shall he corrupt by flatteries: but the people that do know their God shall be strong, and do exploits.

33 And they that understand among the people shall instruct many: yet they shall fall by the sword, and by flame, by captivity, and by spoil, many days.

34 Now when they shall fall, they shall be holpen with a little help: but many shall cleave to them with flatteries.

35 And some of them of understanding shall fall, to try them, and to purge, and to make them white, even to the time of the end: because it is yet for a time appointed.

36 And the king shall do according to his will; and he shall exalt himself, and magnify himself above every god, and shall speak marvellous things against the God of gods, and shall prosper till the indignation be accomplished: for that that is determined shall be done.

37 Neither shall he regard the God of his fathers, nor the desire of women, nor regard any god: for he shall magnify himself above all.

38 But in his estate shall he honour the God of forces: and a god whom his fathers knew not shall he honour with gold, and silver, and with precious stones, and pleasant things.

39 Thus shall he do in the most strong holds with a strange god, whom he shall acknowledge and increase with glory: and he shall cause them to rule over many, and shall divide the land for gain.

40 And at the time of the end shall the king of the south push at him: and the king of the north shall come against him like a whirlwind, with chariots, and with horsemen, and with many ships; and he shall enter into the countries, and shall overflow and pass over.

41 He shall enter also into the glorious land, and many countries shall be overthrown: but these shall escape out of his hand, even Edom, and Moab, and the chief of the children of Ammon.

42 He shall stretch forth his hand also upon the countries: and the land of Egypt shall not escape.

43 But he shall have power over the treasures of gold and of silver, and over all the precious things of Egypt: and the Libyans and the Ethiopians shall be at his steps.

44 But tidings out of the east and out of the north shall trouble him: therefore he shall go forth with great fury to destroy, and utterly to make away many.

45 And he shall plant the tabernacles of his palace between the seas in the glorious holy mountain; yet he shall come to his end, and none shall help him.

Then he closes the temples. (J.S. says “daily sacrifice” is in reference to our temples.) Next page.

Daniel called the scattering of the Jews in 70 AD the “Abomination of Desolation”. 1 million Jews were killed in one night. He said it will happen again before the Second Coming. (Armageddon).

Many saints who will help others will die.

#8 still magnifies himself, even above God and prospers until the indignation (cleansing) comes.

He continues to set up components of the New World Order thinking this is the only way to rescue the mess. He has made a pact “with the league” and he works deceitfully.

There is another skirmish in the Middle East. This time he enters Israel.

He is concerned with the news out of the east and north (China and Russia) and he goes back with great fury with his military (possible invasion).

He dies. Then Michael (Adam) stands up. Dan. 12:1 and that means AOA. Christ will come and put an end to Armageddon. Then, he will come to the world.

1 And at that time shall Michael stand up, the great prince which standeth for the children of thy people: and there shall be a time of trouble, such as never was since there was a nation even to that same time: and at that time thy people shall be delivered, every one that shall be found written in the book.
